A little bit of housekeeping:

PAT (Progressive Achievement Tests)

You may have heard your children speaking about an online computer test in the last few weeks. The school has just completed PAT testing, a series of NAPLAN like test used to ascertain student's abilities in various areas. These tests are Australian Curriculum aligned, and norm referenced using 240 000 students Australia wide allowing us to check how students are achieving compared to their year level peers and the Curriculum. We will repeat the tests at the middle and end of the year to compare growth. It also allows us to look at the effectiveness of the programs within our school and make data driven changes and decisions.

NAPLAN

Our year 3 and 5 students have NAPLAN in weeks 6 and 7 so they are busy preparing. In class they are preparing and have sat practise tests. This is an opportunity for students to experience the conditions and for the school to identify and iron out any issues.

HEC Spelling Bee

Another exciting event was the first of the Hills Education Community events for the year, the Spelling Bee at Mundaring Primary School, I wish to congratulate all students who competed in both the school and interschool competition. You all showed great dedication and resilience.


