Semester One Reports

It has been my privilege to spend time over the past few days chatting to every Kindy to Year 6 student about their learning this semester. During these conversations, it became clear some of the impact that COVID-19 had on students and their wellbeing. Overwhelmingly our students have responded with determination and courage despite some underlying concerns. They lived our four school values of Respect, Achievement, Relationships and Engagement. You will see that there are no grade allocation on the reports. This was a response by the Department of Education due to the Covid -19 pandemic. This is explained further in the Explanatory Notes section of your children's reports (see below).

Schooling in Semester 1 2020 has been widely disrupted due to the COVID-19 pandemic. For this reason, schools are not required to report learning area grades for Semester 1 2020. This means the Overall Learning Area achievement section of the report may be unshaded, and the components for a Learning Area, if applied, may be unchecked or marked as "Not Assessed".

Department of Education Guidelines (These may Change for Term 3)

 Parents/carers and visitors may come on to school sites to attend pre-arranged meetings and for drop off and pick up purposes. We still need to adhere to a physical distancing of one person per 2 square metres and maintain good hygiene practices.

Schools may manage this through:

- staggering pick up and drop off times;
- utilising 'Kiss and Drive' facilities/drop off and pick up locations

Our Continuing School Arrangements:

This means that, until further notice, parents and carers can deliver and collect their children to and from the classroom door but remain outside the room.

Please keep an eye on our Connect notices over the holidays for the Term 3 Kiss 'n' Drive arrangements. Normal school drop off and pick up times will continue.

In summary:

- All students are now due back to school unless they have a medical exemption (please contact me if you are unsure of whether your children qualify.)
- Parents and non-essential visitors are allowed on site (see DoE information above).
- The office door will remain locked, please call ahead or knock on the door if you need to come to the school. All school access for parents and visitors (not dropping or picking up children) must be through the front office.
- Assemblies, excursions, incursions, camps, inter-school sports/events are allowed but with strict guidelines around numbers and physical distancing (more information is coming shortly).
- P&C and Board meetings can recommence as long as there are 100 people or less in attendance and physical distancing rules are adhered to.
- Students who are unwell must stay home.

Prevent the spread of COVID-19

Follow these steps to help prevent the spread of COVID-19 and slow its transmission.

For the latest health information and health related enquiries, refer to the <u>WA Department of Health</u> or phone the helpline 1800 020 080.

Regular and thorough hand-washing

Staff and students should:

- wash hands with soap and running water when hands are visibly dirty;
- wash hands with soap and water and use alcohol-based hand rub (ABHR), before and after eating or prior to food preparation;
- wash hands with soap and water after going to the toilet;
- avoid using handkerchiefs;
- cough and sneeze with a tissue or bent elbow, dispose of used tissues immediately, and use ABHR or soap and water;
- avoid touching eyes, mouth and nose;
- wash hands with soap and water or ABHR when caring for the sick;
- if unwell, avoid contact with others. Sick children and adults need to stay away from school until they are well; and
- make sure workplaces are clean and hygienic, surfaces (e.g. desks and tables) and objects (e.g. telephones, keyboards) need to be wiped with disinfectant regularly.



2020 Voluntary Contributions
