As Term One comes to a close, I'd like to take this opportunity to reflect on what has been a wonderful start to the school year at Gidgegannup Primary School.

You may have noticed a fresh new look in our front office. The space has been updated to reflect the high standards we value at Gidgegannup Primary School—professional, welcoming, and student-focused, and there is still a little bit to do.

Our Easter Hat Parade was an absolute delight! The creativity on display was truly heart-warming, and we are incredibly grateful to *The Vibe* for their generous donations, which ensured that every child received a special Easter gift. Your support brought so much joy to our students.

The ANZAC service held this week was a moving and respectful tribute to the men and women who have served our country. A heartfelt thank you to Simone Harris for her dedication and meticulous organisation, ensuring that the service was both memorable and meaningful.
